






PSYCHOTROPIC DRUG DIRECTORY

Click the 'Stahl Online' icon - and you will be taken to this screen





Click the 'Stockley's Drug Interactions' icon - and you will be taken to this screen



Click the 'Maudsley Prescribing Guidelines in Psychiatry' icon - and you will be taken to this screen



This publication is arranged like a book (not a database) – so you need to scroll down the page to view each chapter.

Alternately, you can use the search box to find a specific drug. When searching, make sure to have the option "This Reference Work" selected – then enter required drug, e.g. risperidone. If you don't have "This Reference Work" selected you'll get results from across all Wiley content.
