






10 WAYS THAT LIBRARY & INFORMATION SERVICES POWER THE HEALTH SECTOR



NO. 1 PATIENT CARE

Clinicians rely on health librarians for quality information to improve the health outcomes of their patients. A national survey of library users in 2012 found that for 83% of respondents library and information services had helped improve health outcomes for patients, and for 76%, the information provided had changed their thinking and improved their diagnosis or treatment plan.

NO. 4 SPECIALIST RESOURCES

Trip PRO [TRIP](#) - Liberating the literature

Trip is a clinical search engine designed to allow users to quickly and easily find and use high-quality research evidence to support their practice and/or care. This resource allows clinicians to search across other content types including images, videos, patient information leaflets, educational courses and news. A searchable database which provides access to the full-text Australian Standards, and some international standards. Searching is by standard title, number, keyword or phrase.

[MIMS](#) - Comprehensive and trusted drug information

Provides full and abbreviated pharmaceutical and drug interaction information available in Australia. It also provides clinical guidelines, pill identification tool, and patient advice. [MIMS](#) is available for Apple and Android.

[Stahl online](#) - Comprehensive neuropsychopharmacology information

Stahl online is comprehensive and regularly updated, providing full access to the entire current Cambridge portfolio of neuropsychopharmacology books by Dr. Stephen Stahl. A one-stop shop, covering everything a doctor, teacher or trainee will ever need to know about neuropsychopharmacology.

NO. 6 INFORMATION LITERACY

Health librarians are not only skilled in information literacy and critical thinking, they help others develop these skills. Anyone can Google; not everyone knows how to identify the most relevant, timely and credible sources. As information seekers, librarians are fast, efficient and thorough, and they provide training for their clients to improve the information literacy of everyone in the organisation.







USING ENDNOTE ONLINE TO ORGANISE YOUR RESEARCH

EndNote allows you to organise references into a personal database. References can be exported directly from electronic resources (eg. via CIAP), or you can create bibliographies and insert references from your EndNote library into documents you are writing in a referencing style of your choice.

LITERATURE SEARCHING

Library staff can undertake literature searches on your behalf. This is a fee-based service, with charges levied on a cost recovery basis. Contact library staff for more information.

NO. 10 DIGITAL EXPERTISE

Health librarians have sound ICT knowledge and skills and are capable and responsible users of new and emerging technologies. Their roles as professionals in health information services are more and more intertwined with roles in information management and information systems and technologies. Working together in teams with other health information professionals, health librarians add value to design, implement, administer and evaluate quality platforms with quality content that deliver successful digital transformation in healthcare organisations.

EDUCATIONAL RECORDINGS

SHARING THE KNOWLEDGE, EXPERTISE

HNE Health Libraries [record a range of educational programs](#) from visiting lecturers and home-grown experts, including Research Innovation, Grand Rounds, Clinical Governance, and JMO/Intern training. Library staff increase the value of these recordings by creating additional links to relevant articles and websites. DOCUMENT SUPPLY

Material not available through HNE Health Libraries can be obtained from other libraries both within Australia and overseas. Articles and books can be obtained on your behalf and mailed, emailed or faxed to you.

REMOTE ACCESS

Remote (off-site) access to electronic resources is available to library members. Use your library barcode and pin to access e-journals, e-books, recorded education and Grand Rounds presentations via the library website.

HNE HEALTH LIBRARIES PROVIDE EVIDENCE BASED RESEARCH SUPPORT

For those undertaking an innovation scholarship project, developing a guideline, undertaking a systematic review or meta-analysis, or for higher degree students, Librarians can support you or your team in many ways, including:

- Develop and refine review topics
- Identify existing systematic reviews on a topic
- Develop a search strategy or review existing search strategies
- Document search strategies
- Customise and conduct a search across relevant databases
- Manage results using Endnote

SYSTEMATIC REVIEWS

Systematic reviews (SRs) with librarian or information specialist co-authors are correlated with significantly higher quality reported search strategies.

To maximise the quality and reporting of search strategies for systematic reviews and to minimise bias in SRs, authors and editors should consider [librarian engagement](#) in the systematic review process.

HNE Health Libraries offer support for those undertaking systematic reviews and other research projects that involve an extensive and exhaustive search of the evidence base.
